If anyone in the application has changed his or her name, certified copies of documents verifying the name change. This might include a marriage or deed poll certificate or a certified copy of evidence which may include: • change of name documents from an Australian Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages, or the relevant overseas authority • documents that show other names you have been known by.

If required, provide Australian police certificate (AFP) if you have spent a total of 12 months or more in Australia in the last 10 years since you turned 16. Only complete disclosure National Police Certificates issued by the Australian Federal Police is accept. Standard disclosure certificates or national police certificates issued by Australian state or territory police will not be Acceptable. For immigration purposes, Australian police certificates are valid for 12 months from the date of issue.



If required, please provide: 1) An overseas police certificate from every country, including your home country, where you spent a total of 12 months or more in the last 10 years since you turned 16. 2) Military service records or discharge papers if you served in the armed forces of any country.

### > Accessing your records





As a former holder of a Norfolk Island immigration permit, your immigration record will be included in Norfolk Island immigration records. Under the Norfolk Island Continued Laws Amendment (2016 Measures No. 1) Ordinance 2016, APS officers of the Department of Home Affairs (the Department) are authorised to access these records and use them for purposes arising, directly or indirectly, under, relevantly, the Migration Act 1958, Australian Citizenship Act 2007 and the Norfolk Island Legislation Amendment Act 2015. Therefore, the Department will be able to verify if you or your parent are a former holder of a Norfolk Island immigration permit for the purposes of making a decision on your visa application.
